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Foreword

This revised British Standard has been prepared under the direction of the Building Services Standards Committee and supersedes BS 1252 : 1957. The standard is divided into three sections as follows.

Section one. Scope, references and definitions.

Section two. Specifies general and constructional requirements.

Section three. Specifies the performance required of an

appliance when subjected to tests including cooking, boiling, hot water production and fuel consumption; the appendices describe the methods of carrying out these tests.

The main difference between this revision and the 1957 edition is that the scope of the standard has been broadened to include cookers fitted with integral boilers that supply water for central heating.
