Foreword

This standard method was developed to meet a requirement to which special attention was drawn at the public enquiry prior to the issue of the Highly Flammable Liquids and Liquefied Petroleum Gases Regulations 1972 (SI 917:1972). The requirement is applicable to products which give a flashpoint within the terms of the regulations and differentiates between those which are combustible and those which are not.

The method is technically identical with that in Schedule 2 of the above regulations, in which its application is not restricted to paint, varnish or to related products.

Compliance with a British Standard does not of itself confer immunity from legal obligations.
