

Methods of test for Aluminium oxide —

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National foreword

This Part of BS 4140 is identical with ISO 2927 “*Aluminium oxide primarily used for the production of aluminium — Sampling*” published by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO).

Terminology and conventions. The text of the International Standard has been approved as suitable for publication, without deviation, as a British Standard. Some terminology and certain conventions are not identical with those used in British Standards; attention is especially drawn to the following. Wherever the words “International Standard” appear, referring to this standard, they should be read as “British Standard”.

Additional information

Complementary sampling standard. Attention is drawn to BS 4140:1967, clause 2, “Preparation and storage of laboratory samples” which describes the preparation of crude samples (for moisture determination and certain physical tests) and ground and dried samples (for the other tests) from the laboratory sample.

This standard prescribes methods of test only, and should not be used or quoted as a specification defining limits of purity. Reference to the standard should indicate that the methods of test used comply with the requirements of BS 4140.

A British Standard does not purport to include all the necessary provisions of a contract. Users of British Standards are responsible for their correct application.

Compliance with a British Standard does not of itself confer immunity from legal obligations.
