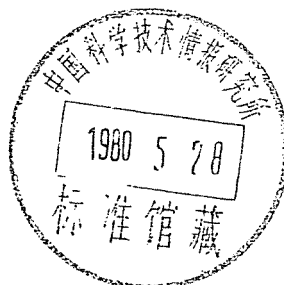

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National foreword

This British Standard is identical with IEC Publication 552 : 1977 'CAMAC — Organization of multi-crate systems. Specification of the Branch-highway and CAMAC crate controller Type A1', and has been prepared under the direction of the Nuclear Engineering Standards Committee. The United Kingdom has taken part in the discussion in International Electrotechnical Commission Technical Committee TC 45 that prepared IEC 552 on the basis of EURATOM document EUR 4600e (1972).

This British Standard defines features of CAMAC that are additional to those given in BS 5554 : 1978, which is identical with IEC 516 : 1977, and to those given in national appendix B of BS 5554 : 1978 that gives extracts from IEC 482 : 1975.

NOTE. IEC 516 : 1977 is based on EURATOM document EUR 4100e.

The formal decisions or agreements of the IEC on technical matters, prepared by technical committees on which all the national committees having a special interest therein are represented, express, as nearly as possible, an international consensus of opinion on the subjects dealt with. These decisions or agreements have the form of recommendations for international use and they are accepted by the national committees in that sense.

Terminology and conventions. The text of the international standard has been approved as suitable for publication, without deviation, as a British Standard. Some terminology and certain conventions are not identical with those used in British Standards; attention is especially drawn to the following.

The comma has been used in one of the figures as a decimal marker. In British Standards it is current practice to use a full point on the baseline as the decimal marker.

References in the text to page numbers relate to IEC page numbers.

The technical committee has reviewed the provisions of this IEC publication, to which reference is made in 1.1 and 1.3, and has decided that they are to be regarded as mandatory for the purposes of this standard.
