National foreword

This Section of this British Standard has been prepared under the direction of the Clay Products Standards Committee and is the English language version of EN 187-2 'Ceramic tiles. Extruded ceramic tiles with a water absorption of $6\% < E \leq 10\%$ (Group AIIb) Part 2' published by the European Committee for Standardization (CEN).

EN 187-2 was produced as a result of international discussion in which the UK took an active part.

This Section covers the requirements only for certain specific products within the stated water absorption range (see clause 1). For all other tiles in this range see Part 4 : Section 4.1

Attention is drawn to the use in this standard of the comma as a decimal marker. This is to accord with European practice, but it should be noted that it is current practice in British Standards to use a full point on the baseline as a decimal marker.

Additional information. When marking or specifying a product (see 6.1 and 6.2) the manufacturer may mark or specify by reference to either the European Standard or the British Standard.

Compliance with a British Standard does not of itself confer immunity from legal obligations.
