This Section of BS 684 is identical with ISO 5509 “*Animal and vegetable fats and oils — Preparation of methyl esters of fatty acids*” published by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO).

Terminology and conventions. The text of the international standard has been approved as suitable for publication, without deviation, as a British Standard. Some terminology and certain conventions are not identical with those used in British Standards; attention is especially drawn to the following. The comma has been used throughout as a decimal marker. In British Standards it is current practice to use a full point on the baseline as the decimal marker.

Where the words “International Standard” appear, referring to this standard, they should be read as “British Standard”.

Cross-reference. There is no British Standard equivalent for ISO/R 661 but similar information is given in BS 684: General introduction.
