National foreword

This British Standard is the official English language version of EN 1015-19:1998, including amendment A1:2004 (incorporating CEN letter of correction October 2004). It is included in a package of standards declared by CEN/TC 125 and it is intended that it will partially supersede BS 4551, *Methods of testing mortars, screeds and plasters*, BS 4551-1:1998, *Physical testing*, the equivalent test method of which will be withdrawn on 30 September 2000.

The start and finish of text introduced or altered by amendment is indicated in the text by tags **A1** **A1**. Tags indicating changes to CEN text carry the number of the CEN amendment. For example, text altered by CEN amendment 1 is indicated by **A1** **A1**.

The UK participation in its preparation was entrusted by Technical Committee B/519, Masonry and associated testing, to Subcommittee B/519/2, Mortar, which has the responsibility to:

- aid enquirers to understand the text;
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- monitor related international and European developments and promulgate them in the UK.
