This British Standard is the official English language version of EN 14781:2005. It partially supersedes BS 6102-1:1992, which will be declared obsolescent on 30 November 2006 following publication of BS EN 14764, BS EN 14765, BS EN 14766 and BS EN 14781 and withdrawn when The Pedal Bicycles (Safety) Regulations 2003 are updated to reference the European Standards.

The UK participation in its preparation was entrusted to Technical Committee GME/25, Cycles, which has the responsibility to:

- aid enquirers to understand the text;
- present to the responsible international/European committee any enquiries on the interpretation, or proposals for change, and keep UK interests informed;
- monitor related international and European developments and promulgate them in the UK.
