This British Standard was published by BSI. It is the UK implementation of EN 15167-2:2006. Together with BS EN 15167-1, it supersedes BS 6699:1992 which will be withdrawn on 1 May 2008.

Additional information

This British Standard acts as a supporting standard to BS EN 15167-1, by describing the tasks required for demonstrating legal attestation of conformity to BS EN 15167-1, which is mandated by the European Commission to be specified under system of attestation of 1+, and which also make appropriate reference to this British Standard. Attestation of conformity is a legal means for demonstrating that a product meets the requirements of a harmonized European Technical Specification, as defined in the Construction Products Directive (89/106/EEC). In the case of a system 1+, it is supported by an EC certificate of conformity, issued by an EU notified body, enabling the manufacturer to issue an EC declaration of conformity and to affix the CE mark. The CE marking indicates a presumption of conformity with the minimum legal health, safety and environmental requirements in the EU members states, it is not a quality mark.

This publication does not purport to include all the necessary provisions of a contract. Users are responsible for its correct application.
