Part 3: Requirements for loaders

National foreword

This British Standard is the UK implementation of EN 474-3:2022 incorporating corrigendum June 2022. It supersedes BS EN 474-3:2006+A1:2009, which is withdrawn.

The UK participation in its preparation was entrusted to Technical Committee B/513/1, Earth moving machinery (International).

BSI, as a member of CEN, is obliged to publish EN 474-3:2022 as a British Standard. However, attention is drawn to the fact that during the development of this European Standard, the UK committee voted against its approval.

The basis for a negative vote on behalf of the UK committee relates the following sub clause:

— 4.1.2, Specific relation to EN 474-1.

Clause 4.1.2 contains an exemption in respect of EN 474-1:2022, 4.22.5, requiring the provision of a support device for machines equipped with a tiltable cabin satisfying certain characteristics of operation and use.

The UK committee did not consider that such an exemption was justified for the machinery that falls within the scope of this standard.

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
