Aircraft — Environmental test procedure for airborne equipment — Resistance to fire in designated fire zones

National foreword

This British Standard is the UK implementation of ISO 2685:1998.

This standard can be used alongside BS 3G 100-2.3.13:1973, but with the following taken into account:

- The specified flame temperature tolerances are larger in this standard than in BS 3G 100-2.3.13:1973;
- The specified heat flux density is much lower in this standard;
- The specified application of vibration is specific to this standard and does not feature in BS 3G 100-2.3.13:1973. Application of vibration during a fire test might not be possible due to size, geometry or weight of the component or equipment under test and/or vibration capability at the potential fire test facilities. The supplier of the test article would need to determine whether the test is achievable, suitable or applicable to ensure that the component or equipment is capable of being subjected to vibration during the selected fire test. The requirement for application of vibration might need to be omitted altogether or downgraded to lower levels of vibration amplitude.

The UK participation in its preparation was entrusted to Technical Committee ACE/1, International and European Aerospace Policy and Processes.
