Low-voltage surge protective devices

Part 12: Surge protective devices connected to low-voltage power distribution systems — Selection and application principles

This publication is not to be regarded as a British Standard.

It is being issued in the Draft for Development series of publications and is of a provisional nature. It should be applied on this provisional basis, so that information and experience of its practical application can be obtained.

A PAS is a Technical Specification not fulfilling the requirements for a standard, but made available to the public and established in an organization operating under a given procedure.

A review of this Draft for Development will be carried out not later than three years after its publication.

Notification of the start of the review period, with a request for the submission of comments from users of this Draft for Development, will be made in an announcement in the appropriate issue of Update Standards. According to the replies received, BSI Technical Committee EPL/49 will judge whether the validity of the PAS should be extended for a further three years or what other action should be taken and pass their comments on to the relevant international committee.

Observations which it is felt should receive attention before the official call for comments will be welcomed. These should be sent to the Secretary of BSI Technical Committee EPL/49 at British Standards House, 389 Chiswick High Road, London W4 4AL.
