FOREWORD

ISO (the International Organization for Standardization) is a worldwide federation of national standards institutes (ISO Member Bodies). The work of developing International Standards is carried out through ISO Technical Committees. As part of this process, International Standard ISO 1443 replaces ISO Recommendation R 1443-1970 drawn up by Technical Committee ISO/TC 34, *Agricultural food products*.
