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FOREWORD

ISO (the International Organization for Standardization) is a worldwide federation of national standards institutes (ISO Member Bodies). This International Standard cancels and replaces ISO Recommendation R 768-1968, which was approved in October 1965 by the Member Bodies of the following countries :
