ISO RECOMMENDATION R 193

MICROCOPIES ON TRANSPARENT BASES
SIZES OF RECOMMENDED BASES

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BRIEF HISTORY

The ISO Recommendation R 193, *Microcopies on Transparent Bases. Sizes of Recommended Bases*, was drawn up by Technical Committee ISO/TC 46, *Documentation*, the Secretariat of which is held by the Association Française de Normalisation (AFNOR).

Work on this matter which the Technical Committee had begun since the year 1955 resulted in 1958 in the adoption of a proposal as a first Draft ISO Recommendation and came to an end, in 1959, with the adoption of a second Draft ISO Recommendation.

On 30 April 1959, the Draft ISO Recommendation (No. 68) was distributed to all the ISO Member Bodies and was approved by the following Member Bodies:

One Member Body opposed the approval of the Draft: Italy.

The Draft ISO Recommendation was then submitted by correspondence to the ISO Council, which decided, in March 1961, to accept it as an ISO RECOMMENDATION.
