COMMON NAMES FOR PESTICIDES FOURTH LIST

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BRIEF HISTORY

The ISO Recommendation R 290, *Common Names for Pesticides—Fourth List*, was drawn up by Technical Committee ISO/TC 81, *Common Names for Pesticides*, the Secretariat of which is held by the British Standards Institution (B.S.I.).

Work on this question by the Technical Committee began in 1959 and led, in 1960, to the adoption of a Draft ISO Recommendation.

In October 1960, this Draft ISO Recommendation (No. 412) was circulated to all the ISO Member Bodies for enquiry. It was approved, subject to a few amendments, by the following Member Bodies:

Two Member Bodies opposed the approval of the Draft:

France, Republic of South Africa.

The Draft ISO Recommendation was then submitted by correspondence to the ISO Council, which decided, in January 1963, to accept it as an ISO RECOMMENDATION.
