ISO RECOMMENDATION

R 644

CONVENTIONAL SIGNS
TO BE USED IN SCHEMES FOR THE INSTALLATIONS
OF VENTILATION SYSTEMS IN SHIPS

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BRIEF HISTORY

The ISO Recommendation R 644, *Conventional signs to be used in schemes for the installations of ventilation systems in ships*, was drawn up by Technical Committee ISO/TC 8, *Shipbuilding Details*, the Secretariat of which is held by the Nederlands Normalisatie-instituut (NNI).

Work on this question by the Technical Committee began in 1960 and led, in 1965, to the adoption of a Draft ISO Recommendation.

In October 1965, this Draft ISO Recommendation (No. 856) was circulated to all the ISO Member Bodies for enquiry. It was approved, subject to a few modifications of an editorial nature, by the following Member Bodies:

No Member Body opposed the approval of the Draft.

The Draft ISO Recommendation was then submitted by correspondence to the ISO Council, which decided, in December 1967, to accept it as an ISO RECOMMENDATION.
