



Small craft — Rigging screws for stainless steel wire rope — Principal dimensions for forks, connection pins and eye-holes

The reasons which led to the decision to publish this document in the form of a technical report type 1 are explained in the Introduction.

0 Introduction

Draft International Standard ISO/DIS 4558 was distributed to the member bodies in 1980. The results of the vote were examined by the appropriate technical committee which decided firstly, to consider adding lengths of open and closed rigging screws to the Draft and secondly, to reach agreement on the dimensions shown in the table.

In 1984, analysis of the comments and proposals relating to this study revealed the impossibility of changing existing practices in the countries concerned.

It was then decided to stop the work and propose drawing up a technical report, of type 1, allowing the member bodies interested to refer to it, thereby eventually facilitating harmonization.

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
